Pastor's Column

Greetings Members and Friends of Wesley United Methodist Church,

As I write this letter, I am watching the opening days of The 2020 General Conference, yes the 2020 Conference that is finally happening in 2024. In the Opening Worship service, Bishop Thomas Bickerton of the New York Area preached a sermon that set the tone for the weeks ahead. See the excerpt below from UM News.

Council of Bishops President Thomas J. Bickerton opened the postponed 2020 United Methodist General Conference on April 23 with a bold question: "Do you want to be in this room?" He was speaking to delegates from Africa, Europe, Asia and the U.S. who are gathering to consider major proposals that could dramatically change the denomination. "Are you willing to move forward in a spirit of hope and embrace a season of reformation, commit to the revitalization of The United Methodist Church and work for a culture marked by compassion, courage and companionship?" Bickerton asked. If not, he said, "Maybe you are in the wrong place."

On the second day, Bishop L. Jonathan Holston of the South Carolina Annual Conference cited wisdom from former United States ambassador and pastor Andrew Young, as he noted the paradox of humanity can be described in this way: "We live in the tension of who we are, who we say we are and who we want to be." And so I invite us into a season at Wesley UMC: Aurora to think about that tension...who we are, who we say we are, and who we want to be. What I have heard in my first 10 months of serving as your pastor is that Wesley is a welcoming community, a safe space for all persons to ask questions and grow in their faith. And I think we do a pretty good job of being who we say we are, but there is always more that can be done!

That work begins with asking the question "why"...why do we do what we do? If we know why we do what we do, what we do will make a difference. So what is our "why"? On Sunday, April 7th, the Governing Board and staff gathered for a mini retreat to walk through a process of "Finding Our Why". We began by telling stories about what makes us most proud to be a part of Wesley UMC and thinking about what contributions Wesley has made in the lives of others. The stories that were shared and the contributions made over

the years led us to this Why Statement: To grow and provide a welcoming, all-inclusive community so that all feel empowered and loved as the children of God. WOW! This is why Wesley UMC exists...to make sure that there is a safe space that is inclusive and welcoming for all people to feel empowered and know they are loved by God! So what we do: worship, Wednesday Night Gathering, book studies, social gatherings, Art & Soul Camp, partnering with community organizations in our building (ECHO, Boy & Girl Scouts, Shine Within, etc) all comes out of that WHY. This is a church I am excited to be a part of...how about you?!

In the 16th century, Dutch Theologian, Desiderius Erasmus is quoted as having said, "There is no joy in possession without sharing." Friends, we have greater joy when we share that which brings us joy! I hope that you will consider sharing Wesley UMC with someone! Invite someone to worship! Share our Facebook posts! Forward an email from Wesley to a friend! Take a postcard about Art & Soul Camp to children in your neighborhood! Let like minded community organizations know that Wesley is a safe space for their meetings & events! If we work together to share the joy that comes from being a church that loves and welcomes all people...we will begin to live more fully into who we want to be!

Al Benson was honored for his work capturing the mission of Wesley and United Women in Faith in his photographs and articles submitted to local newspapers.



LandBack Movement

Celebrate a Victory for the LandBack Movement

After stealing 1300 acres of Potawatomi homelands 175 years ago, the US Department of the Interior has finally placed some portions of the stolen land in a trust for the Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation. You can read or listen to the story here:

The LandBack movement seeks to address the historical and ongoing injustices experienced by Indigenous People as a result of settler colonialism.

This includes the return of Tribal Sovereignty, honoring treaties, and returning land management and environmental stewardship to Native Peoples. This enables Indigenous Peoples to reconnect with traditions, protect the land, and exercise autonomy. (from a piece by Nony Rose Salyer for "Red House," an initiative to Indigenize media)

As Christians, we can support the LandBack movement by raising awareness and looking for opportunities to contribute, as we acknowledge the harm done to Indigenous people over several generations.




Wesley Gardens


